The rates and charges contained herein are those prescribed by the Nebraska Public Service Commission

Initially, all carriers must select a rate schedule according to its area of domicile, including the optional peak season hourly rates, and notify the Commission by letter or facsimile of its adoption of a particular rate schedule. After the initial selection, a carrier may change its selection at any time by embracing a different rate schedule subject to the following criteria:

- a. The commission must be notified of the carrier's intent to change its rate schedule selection;
- b. The Commission must acknowledge receipt of the carrier's request; and
- c. The effective date of the change will occur fifteen (15) days after the Commission receives the request.

The optional peak season hourly rates are only authorized for those carriers who file notice with the Commission of their intent to use these rates. The optional peak season hourly rates may only be used during the period of time specified.
