(A) Pages 42 to 45 reflect the master distances between principal points in Nebraska.

Example: The distances between Rulo and Maxwell are 316 miles. Since the exact distance between Rulo and Maxwell is not identified in the master distance mileage guide, the following procedure will be followed to determine the exact mileage.

Use current highway map edited by and obtainable from the Department of Roads, $14^{\text {th }}$ and Burnham Street, Lincoln, Nebraska 68502, to determine mileage over and above the master distance shown on Pages 42 to 45 of this tariff.
(B) In instances where either consignor, consignee, or both request transportation of the shipment over a particular route or combination of routes and such routing reflects a greater distance than the shor line distance determined in accordance with Paragraph (A) hereof, the greater distance shall be used in determination of charges.
(C) If transportation of the tendered shipment is not possible over the short line distance determined in accordance with Paragraph (A) hereof due to operating hazard, load limitation of the highway, bridges, underpasses or any other highway limitation, mileage computed over the actual route of movement shall apply.
(D) Fractions of a mile less than $1 / 2$ shall be dropped; fractions of $1 / 2$ mile or greater shall be increased to the next whole mile.
(E) When in the course of transportation it becomes necessary to obtain a special permit from the state or any political subdivision of the state, the distance shall be determined via the route specified in such permit.
